### Fly Tying

This month I want to look at some new material on the market, called UV2. UV2 has both UVR and UVF (2 spectrums of light) which makes it very visible to fish, especially in low light, dirty water, or deep water. At the moment UV2 is available as dubbing and is great for nymphs and bodies of harling flies. I have been experimenting with this to great success recently. Here is an excerpt which describes it a little better: 'UVF or Ultraviolet Fluorescence is what most fishermen and tyers are familiar with. The example of shining a black light onto a white shirt or some bright orange thread and having it glow is what is often touted as the type of effect that will attract fish to our flies. However, with few exceptions, there aren't many instances of fluorescence in the natural trout world. UVR or Ultraviolet Reflection is the ability of a surface (insect, feather, fur or otherwise) to reflect, not fluoresce, UV light. In nature, there are ample examples of animals, insects and fish using UVR to both attract mates as well as hunt for food. This deserves some additional consideration.

For the fly tyer, many natural insects and baitfish exhibit UVR characteristics to varying degrees. Given that trout can see UVR, it's reasonable to assume UVR can and does play a part in a trout identifying and selecting its food.' Flyfishfood.com

# Recipe of the Month

### Smoked Trout Pate

(An old recipe but well worth trying!)

### Ingredients:

1 smoked trout—how you smoke it is up to you!

1 250ml tub of sour cream

1 250ml tub of cream cheese

1-2 Tablespoons of lemon juice

Salt & pepper to taste

#### How to:

Flake the smoked trout into a blender, keeping a few pieces aside for later.

Add in Sour Cream, Cream Cheese, Lemon Juice & Salt & Pepper. Blend together using short bursts on the pulse button.

Once it has acquired a well mixed consistency remove and refrigerate for 20 minutes.

Serve with crusty bread and scatter the extra pieces of Smoked Trout over the top.

If you prefer a stronger taste you can add a dash of chilli powder. It is a great entrée, or even on toast in the morning instead of the evil marmite!!

The lake water has been getting a good stirrup mixing the hot and cooler waters together.

Harling across the river mouths just on the drop offs has been guite effective when able to get out. Some beautiful hen's have been landed. Further out there seem to be a lot of smaller fish around.

My thoughts would be harling for the first hour of daylight then move out to deeper water. Small flies like Yellow Lady and Green Orbit should be guite effective.

Later in the day try the edges of the dropoffs, watch your sounder for sign!!
